This past year has been one of the most unusual and challenging years of my life. I can imagine that for most of us, external circumstances, such as the global pandemic, have dominated our thoughts and have had an influence on how we look at the year that went by. Despite the challenges, there is plenty to celebrate !

One of my 2021 highlights was a time of reflection with the BMF Executive team about WHY we do the work we do. What are the stories that give us the emotions that we will remember forever?

We collectively summarized our WHY as the joy that comes from inspiring, equipping and uniting the next generation leadership. We have seen and continue to connect with hundreds of young disciples who want to make God's name known globally. We are so inspired by their desire to learn, their determination to connect globally and their humility to be trained in the ministry.

In this annual report we are honoured to share some of our 2021 highlights:

- 45 students graduated and are now serving in the ministry across the globe.
- 15 next generation candidates started our Chance of A Lifetime program to be trained full time for 15 months in various areas of ministry. Twelve more candidates will join in 2022, forming the group known as "COAL Season2".
- 265 students attended our schools of missions on all continents !
- Two Sessions / Semesters of our Global Connect class entitled « ICOC History » and « Unity and Bible Interpretation » took place. Over 160 students enrolled for each semester.

We are filled with gratitude for our students, trainers, the local churches and our generous donors who make all this possible and are excited to see how God will continue to work.

In 1953, a young Oklahoma City entrepreneur started fabricating and installing automotive seat covers. His name was Tom Beam. In 1955, shortly after factory-installed seatbelts were introduced in new vehicles, Tom Beam saw the potential in automotive aftermarket seatbelts and started his company called Beam's Seatbelts.

He had a vision for the future of high impact missions and wanted to make a difference and give as many people as possible a chance to know the gospel around the world.

In this spirit the schools of missions have been established through his generous donation:

To train and equip the next generation to go and make disciples of all nations.

Thanks to his generous donation twelve schools across the globe have received grants and graduates have been sent to cities and countries to lead and plant churches, armed and ready to build God's kingdom for the future. 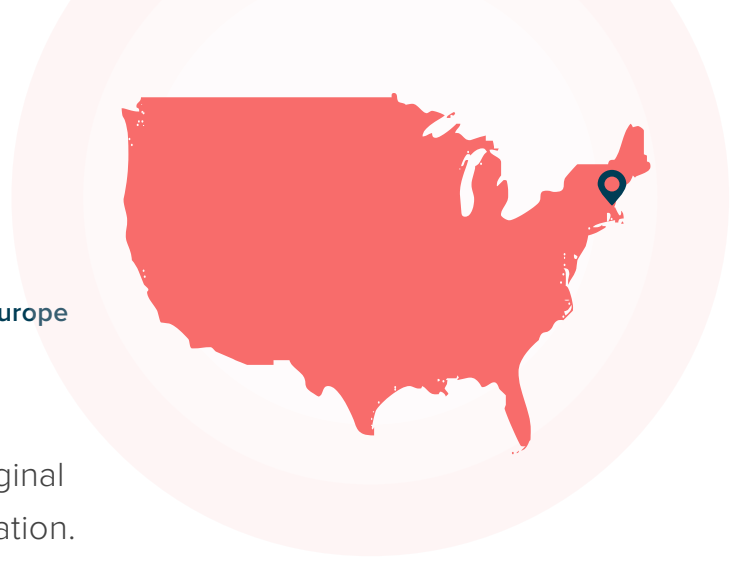

The New England School of Missions was the original pilot school funded by the Beam Missions Foundation. Established in 2010, NESM became the prototype school that the other programs would be modeled after. For the past decade NESM has graduated 39 students and has sent out half of them to serve churches overseas in London, Oxford, Zurich, Madrid, Milan, Prague, Berlin, Budapest, and Sydney.

South Pacific School of Missions

The SPSM was established in 2012 and is led by Mike Fontenot as the director and Sam Cameron as the lead trainer. The first session took place in Sydney with an attendance of around 20 students. They started with 161 members in the Sydney Church and 750 in the region at the beginning of 2013. Since that time, God has graciously been building up the region and Mission School.

Since the start of the school, there have been 21 ministry staff that have been trained. In 2021, SPSM had two more students graduate ! God is using the school to make a tremendous impact on the region.

The Bangalore School of Missions was founded in 2012. Since then the School of Missions (SOM) in Bangalore has been training young people with a missionary vision to equip them to return to their communities and serve in the ministry. The SOM continues to play an active role in the mission work. Two new churches have been planted in India with the help of students of the School of Missions. All of the students were placed in one of the two mission teams that were sent out for a period of 3 months to preach the word where it has not been preached. Since its inception in 2012 the BSoM has trained and placed over 40 people into the full time ministry.

The work of training Europe's next generation of leaders began in Kiev with the Eastern European School of Missions under the direction of Shawn and Lena Wooten. They trained more than a dozen young visionaries who are currently serving in churches large and small.

In a very exciting development, the European training effort has now grown to include both Eastern and Western European countries which has been named the European School of Missions. The school is currently being led by Micha and Dani Brueck in Munich (Germany) with Thomas McGuirk as lead trainer in Paris (France) and Jonathan Buchholz in Milan (Italy).

The school graduated 24 students in 2021, A total of 14 ESOM students (4 Current students and 10 Graduated students) are or will be ministry staff in the next few months.

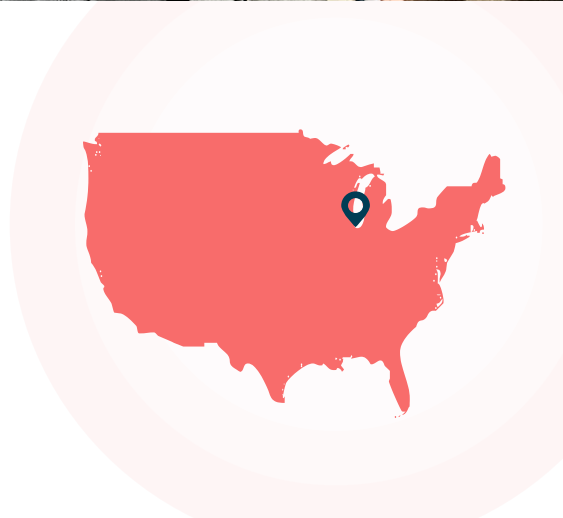

The Asia Pacific SoM serves more than a quarter billion people in The Philippines and Myanmar. This program is both highly structured and extremely effective. The program was established to train a new generation of faith filled leaders and often challenged the students to support themselves for the 2 years they served as “Scholars”. This “extra mile” dedication has really paid off in significant ways as they have seen 34 students complete the program and 31 of those graduates have been hired into full time positions around the region. Dr. Rolan Monje has headed up this dynamic program from its inception and has led the team from strength to strength.

The West Africa School of Missions, based in Lagos, Nigeria, was established in 2016 and has been one of our most successful programs to date. The region of West Africa is in great need of young leadership. God has brought together students from different countries and tribes, and this is bringing unity even through marriages that have developed amongst the students. The school of missions has infused faith and energy into the local congregations that are dreaming again for the future.

Young people are excited to be trained and eager to serve God and their region of the world. The school is led by Chris and Rolayo Ogbonnaya. Since 2016, they have trained and graduated 16 students from all over West Africa and nearly all of whom are serving on the mission field. Looking forward, there are 18 students currently enrolled and being prepared to serve God in dynamic ways.

This year, ASOM joined the Caribbean missions society and has expanded for the first time to enroll students from the South East region; from Tennessee and North Carolina!



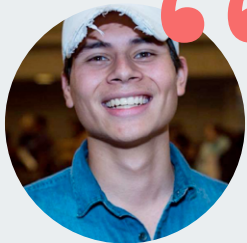

Mexico City is the largest Spanish speaking city in the world with a population of more than 20 million people. It is home to the second largest church in our fellowship of nearly 4,000. A few years ago, the leadership realized that there was a desperate need to train the next generation of leadership as their youngest member on staff was nearly 40 years old.

The Mexico City church approached the Beam Missions Foundation and devised a plan to get a School of Missions established. God provided all the necessary elements for this dream to become a reality. Arturo Elizarraras, the school's director, along with seasoned Evangelists and Women's Ministry Leaders form a dynamic team. Currently, the LATAM School of Missions is training 15 students who are all serving in some capacity and the vast majority are serving in the paid ministry staff.

The twenty one current students in the Eurasia school are spread out between Saint Petersburg and Moscow, Russia . All five of the students in St. Petersburg are working for the ministry, two young married couples leading Teens and Campus and one single sister helping with Young Professionals. Some of these students initiated and took part in the mission team to Kaliningrad last August. Young disciples from other cities joined the team and it has been very successful. Two people were baptized since its inception with more studying the Bible. The church now counts 10 disciples.

In Moscow, sixteen students are currently being trained. Two of their alumni, a married couple, moved to Chelyabinsk, a smaller church in the Urals to continue their training and build a youth group there.

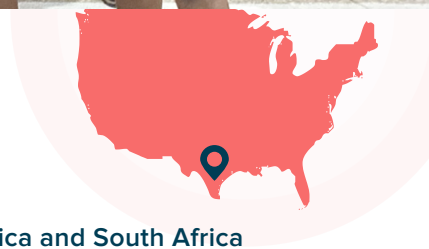

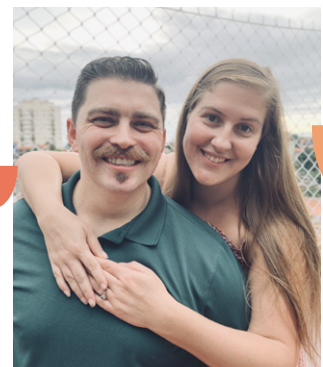

BMF Global Connect Class

The Global Connect Classes started in the fall of 2020 and are now offering 2 classes per year; one in the spring and one in the fall, with 4 to 7 online sessions for each class.

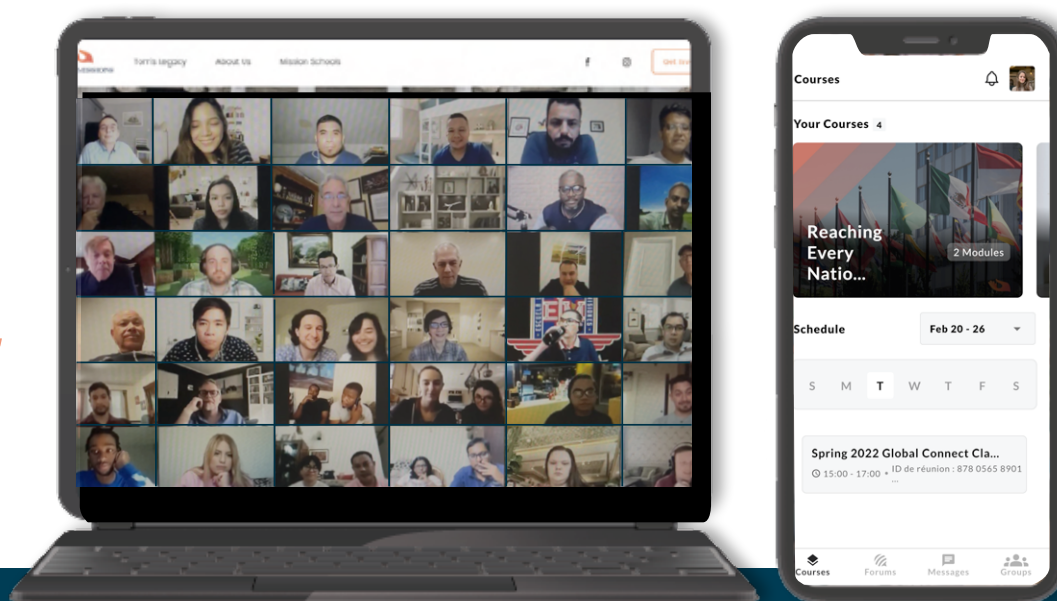
Classes are attended by over 200 participants and student working in International Study Groups to exchange ideas and build relationships. Topics have included :

- Biblical Preaching: “They Spoke so effectively”
- ICOC History: the class inspired us to support Disciples Today’s building of the ICOC History website <https://icochistory.org/>
- Unity: “May they be One”

Going forward, our plan is to have one Global Connect online class per semester with exciting topics like:

- Global Missions: “Into All the World”
- Helping the Poor
- Technology as a tool for Missions
- History and Geography of Israel

In 2021, we have successfully launched our Global Connect App, which is used to connect our students, trainers and directors worldwide.



Chance of a Lifetime

In 2021, God placed it on our hearts at the Beam Missions Foundation to begin a program in partnership with “Hope 4 Kids”, to clear a path for young visionaries to explore Kingdom adventures for 15 months in 3 locations around the world. When that opportunity was announced, 40 young dreamers applied in just a few weeks. We had initially hoped for 10 people to participate, but God opened hearts and doors to allow 15 faith filled young people to begin this adventure and explore God’s plan for their lives.

Since the start of COAL, lifelong relationships have been built. Their final phase is fast approaching and in May 2022, they will all be sent on missionary journeys to Manilla, Philippines, Frankfurt, Germany and Johannesburg, South Africa.

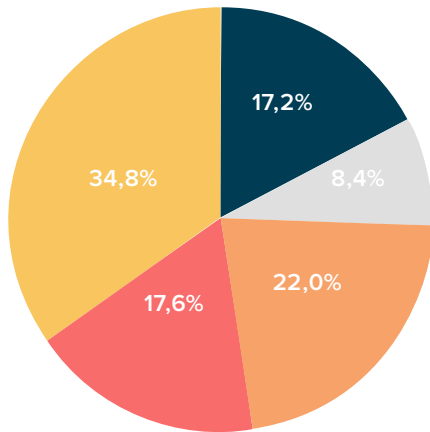
